



craig residence hall and craig union (men)



Craig Residence Hall is a three-story building where approximately 150 men live in two-, three-, and four-bedroom suites (four to eight students in each suite), and share a common living area and one or two baths. The suites open to outside corridors or to the central game/activity room. Craig Union is the original structure in which three double rooms are arranged around a common room and a large common bath.

Each common area has a dining table with chairs, one lounge chair, one sofa, one end table and one TV cube, all with an oak finish. Upholsteries are multi-colored. Four to six residents share a small microwave and compact refrigerator (3.6 cu. ft.). Only one supplemental refrigerator per bedroom is allowed (not to exceed 4.0 cu. ft. interior capacity and with a three-prong/120 volt plug). No additional microwaves are permitted.



The color scheme for bedrooms: bright white ceilings and white walls, navy blue or green door trim (depending on the floor) and baseboards, tan doors and full-spectrum daylight-quality lighting. Floor coverings are: tan linoleum (Craig Hall), or multi-colored tiles (Craig Union) in a striped navy, green, khaki and grey pattern. Students may bring their own area rugs (a 3'x5' or 5'x8' rug easily fits).

Typical Craig Hall suites have two bathrooms shared by one to three people. Each bathroom has a vanity area with sink (no drawer and limited cabinet space for toiletry items), a toilet and tub/shower combination (60" wide with white vinyl curtain). For additional storage, residents may bring over-the-toilet cabinets that are supported by poles; wall attachments are not allowed.



In Craig Union, each suite has a bathroom that six residents share. Features: two pedestal sinks, a toilet, urinal, two individual showers with curtains (white vinyl), and a towel bar. There ARE no drawer or cabinet spaces for toiletry items.

Craig Hall features: a large lounge for studying, meeting with friends and watching a large-screen TV; laundry facilities (second floor); a computer room. In addition, the building contains a multi-zone fire alarm system, digital security camera system and 24-hour information/security desk.

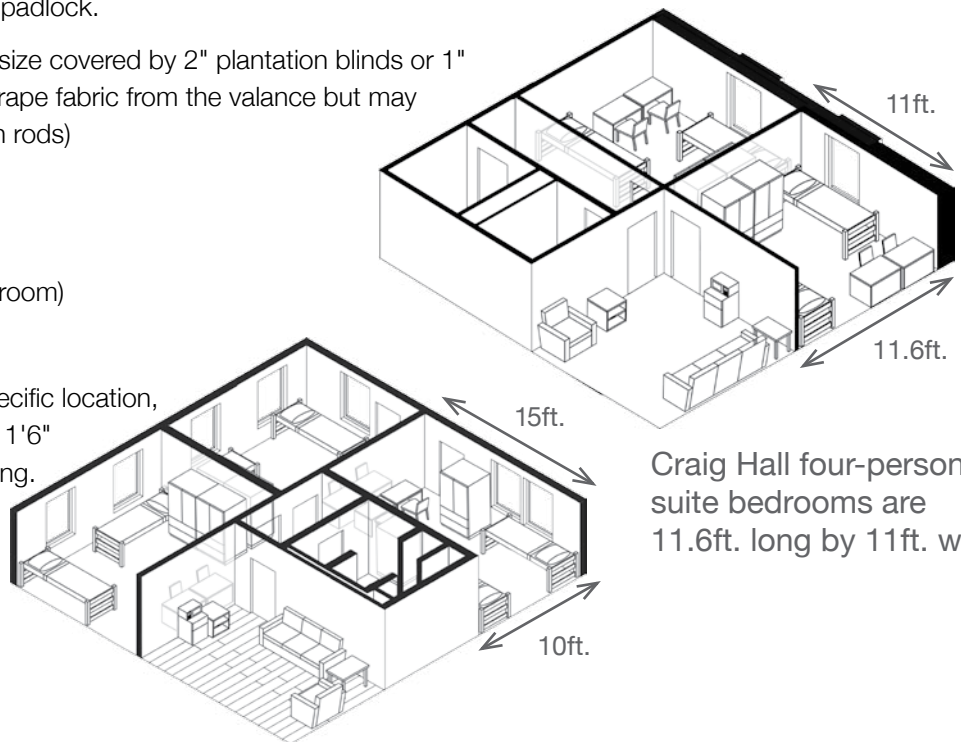

craig residence hall and craig union bedrooms

- Two oak-finish wood-frame single beds (80" long x 36" wide" long), semi-lofted* and bunkable – twin-long sheets
* gives approximately 30" of vertical clearance under the bed
- Two oak-finish desks (42" wide x 24" deep x 30" high). Each desk has a retractable keyboard and mouse surface with rear storage, retractable reference shelf, two open shelves and one storage drawer.
- Two oak wood-frame desk chairs with a medium blue upholstered seat and back
- Two oak-finish wardrobe cabinets (30" wide x 24" deep x 72" high) with two drawers (30" wide x 24" deep). Wardrobes are fitted with a hasp for a padlock.
- Single or double windows that vary in size covered by 2" plantation blinds or 1" aluminum mini-blinds (students may drape fabric from the valance but may not use wall- or frame-fastened curtain rods)
- Air conditioning
- Telephone hook-up (per bedroom)
- Basic cable television service (per bedroom)
- "Wired" Internet service (per student)

Although dimensions vary according to specific location, a typical Craig Union bedroom measures 11'6" wide x 14'0" long, or 10'0" wide x 15'6" long. Craig Hall bedrooms are generally 11'6" wide x 11'6" long.
