



george street apartments (coed/upperclassman)



This facility provides full apartments for 199 co-ed upperclassmen. Apartments are on the second through fifth floors. Each apartment has three to five fully furnished single-occupancy bedrooms with full-size beds, a fully furnished living room, a kitchen (equipped with stove, microwave, and full-size refrigerator), and either one or two bathrooms. All units overlook an open courtyard.



The color scheme for the George Street Apartments is: bright white walls and ceilings with tan tile flooring in the kitchen, bedrooms, and bathrooms, and tan "sisal-look" carpeting in the living room area. The common spaces within the apartment have full-spectrum "daylight quality" lighting; however, the bedrooms do not have any overhead lighting. Therefore, students will need to bring desk, floor or table lamps to light the bedroom area (no halogen lamps are allowed). Students may bring their own area rugs.



Each apartment has a full kitchen with a stove, full-size refrigerator, microwave, cabinets, sink with garbage disposal and dishwasher. (Students may not bring microwaves and/or mini-refrigerators.) There is also a common area with dining table and chairs or barstools at the kitchen counter (depending on apartment layout), two love seats in multi-colored fabric, one coffee table, two end tables and one TV cube. All furniture has a cherry-wood finish.

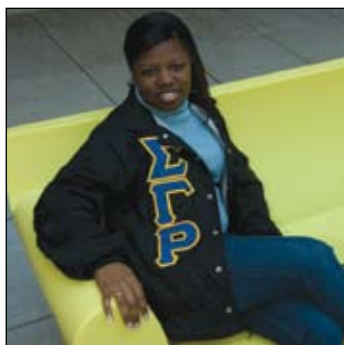
Two or three people share a bathroom (suites have one or two bathrooms) and each bathroom comes with a vanity area with sink, a toilet and tub/shower combination (60" wide with white vinyl curtain). The vanity has limited drawer and/or cabinet space. For additional storage, residents may bring over-the-toilet cabinets that are supported by poles; wall attachments are not allowed.

Each apartment has its own washer and dryer (free of charge) that is to be shared among the students living in the apartment.



Community space is limited to an entry courtyard on the ground floor and two open rooftop courtyards atop the first floor. There are retail outlets on the first floor and the cafeteria is located on the first floor of the Liberty Street Residence Hall next door. In addition, the building contains a multi-zone fire alarm system, fire sprinkler system, digital security camera system and exterior lock proximity readers operated by resident key fobs.

The George Street Apartments are open continuously from August through May.

george street apartments bedrooms

- Wood-frame full-size bed (75" long x 54" wide) – *height adjustable - full-standard sheets
* gives approximately 28" of clearance at highest position
- A cherry-finish desk (60" wide x 24" deep x 30" high). Section one of the desk has a retractable keyboard and mouse surface with rear storage. Sections two and three each have a reference shelf and three storage drawers.
- A cherry wood-frame desk chair with a plum colored upholstered seat
- A cherry-finish three-drawer chest (36" wide x 24" deep x 30" high)
- A wardrobe cabinet (36" wide x 24" deep x 72" high)
- Window size varies, but the average is 38" wide x 70" high. They are covered by 1" aluminum mini-blinds (students may drape fabric from the valance but may not use wall- or frame-fastened curtain rods).
- Air conditioning
- Telephone hook-up (per bedroom)
- Basic cable television service (per bedroom)
- "Wired" Internet service (per student)

Bedroom dimensions vary, but the average size is 9' 3" wide x 11' 3" deep.
