

warren place (coed/upperclassmen)



Warren Place is a residential complex consisting of three buildings (1 Warren, 10 Warren and 20 Warren Street). This co-ed complex houses 287 upperclassmen in fully furnished apartments consisting of two, three, four, or five single-occupancy bedrooms, one or two bathrooms and a full kitchen. Each apartment has a full kitchen, carpet throughout all living areas, and fully furnished living room and bedrooms.

The color scheme for all apartments is: ivory walls, white ceilings, tan or grey trim and tan cut-pile carpeting. Each apartment has a full kitchen with a stove, full-size refrigerator, microwave, cabinets, sink with garbage disposal and dishwasher. (Students may not bring microwaves and/or mini-refrigerators.) There is also a common area with dining table and chairs or barstools at the kitchen counter (depending on apartment layout), one lounge chair, one sofa, one coffee table, two end tables and one TV cube. All furniture has a cherry-wood finish.



Two or three people share a bathroom (suites have one or two bathrooms) and each bathroom comes with a vanity area with sink, a toilet and tub/shower combination (60" wide with white vinyl curtain). The vanity has limited drawer and cabinet space. For additional storage, residents may bring over-the-toilet cabinets that are supported by poles; wall attachments are not allowed.



There is a laundry facility on the first floor of each building and covered bicycle storage in an outside area shared by the residents of all the buildings. In addition, each building contains a multi-zone fire alarm system, fire sprinkler system, digital security camera system and exterior lock proximity readers operated by resident key fobs.

"The campus footprint is very condensed, so classes aren't far away.

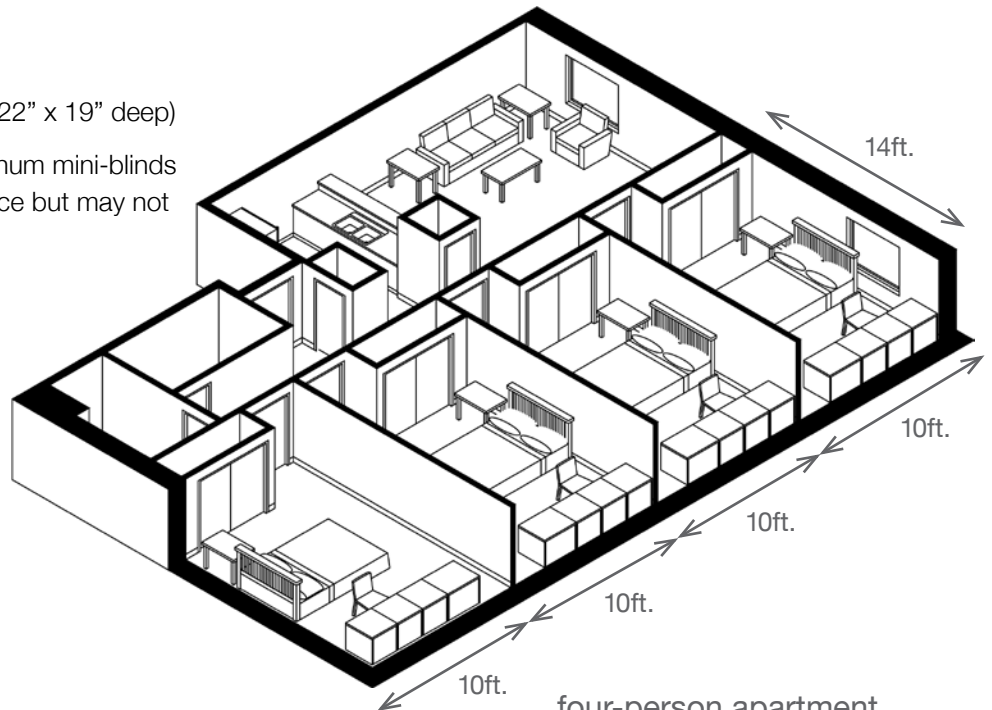

warren place bedrooms

- Wood-frame full-size bed* (75" long x 54 wide") – full-standard sheets
* not height adjustable (one foot of clearance)
- Individual cherry-finish desk with three modular components: one has a retractable keyboard and mouse surface with rear storage; another has a reference shelf, drawer, and cabinet equipped with hasp that allows the cabinet to be locked; a third consists of two open shelves. Each component is 24" wide x 24" deep x 30" high and all sections align to form a continuous 72" desktop surface.
- Cherry wood-frame desk chair with plum-colored upholstered seat and back
- Three-drawer, cherry-finish chest of drawers (30" wide x 24" deep x 30" high) designed to align with desk to create a 102" continuous work surface
- Closet 96" high x 78" wide x 24" deep
- Cherry-finish end table/night stand (29" x 22" x 19" deep)
- Window (average 30" x 70") with 1" aluminum mini-blinds (students may drape fabric from the valance but may not use wall- or frame-fastened curtain rods)
- Air conditioning
- Telephone hook-up (per bedroom)
- Basic cable television service (per bedroom)
- "Wireless" Internet service (per student)

Exact dimensions vary with each apartment throughout the three buildings and there are 28 different floor plans. The most common are 14' long x 10'6" wide.
